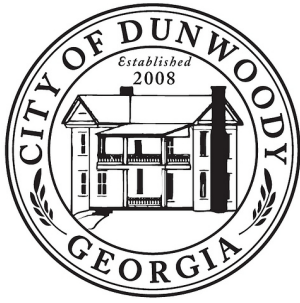
Dunwoody Holding Series of Public Meetings to Discuss Comprehensive Plan
